### Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) - What is it?

VTAC is the main body responsible for managing offers and applications for University Institutions in Victoria. This includes the administering of offers and applications for RMIT undergraduate degrees and TAFE courses, as well as scholarship and SEAS applications.



### Prerequisite Subjects

These are subjects that you must have completed in high school to allow for entry into RMIT programs.



### Selection Tasks

Selection tasks (also known as selection requirements) are tasks that you are required to do in addition to your application for some RMIT programs.

Depending on which course you want to do, there's a range of different selection tasks you may be required to complete such as submitting a folio, or attending an interview.

## Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

A SEAS application allows RMIT to apply equity-related adjustments to your selection rank, by taking into consideration circumstances that have affected performance in high school studies. The maximum equity adjustment you can receive when applying for SEAS is 20 aggregate points.
