Work-Integrated Learning


RMIT specialises in practical, industry-based learning designed to give our students the in-demand skills and professional experience that make employers sit up and take notice.

Pathways to your child's dream degree

Offering pathway programs and various intakes, RMIT ensures your child can access their dream degree.

Foundation Studies

Designed specifically for international students, RMIT Foundation Studies is a direct pathway to higher study at RMIT, both at vocational and undergraduate level. Comparable in standard to an Australian Year 12 curriculum, the Foundation Studies programs are delivered by RMIT Training with six streams to choose from:

- Art, Design and Architecture
- Business

- **Engineering and Science**
- Health
- Communication and Social Context
- Information Technology (IT) .

Our #1 priority is ensuring your child is safe, healthy and happy during their studies in Melbourne. RMIT offers a number of resources to make this possible for all our students.

RMIT Connect

The on-campus contact for international students and their parents, for supporton all general academic and personal enquiries.

24/7 campus security and patrol

Contactable at all times for emergencies, non-urgent police assistance, security accompaniment on campus, and after-hours campus access.

SafeZone

RMIT's exclusive free mobile app, which helps students raise immediate emergencies or first aid alerts, check in with campus security, and share locations at any time.

Safer Community

At RMIT, we are committed to providing a respectful and safe place to study. If your child feels unsafe or is unsure of what to do about threatening or unwanted behaviour, they can talk to a member of Safer Community about their concerns and options.

Academic support and wellbeing

At RMIT, your child is supported to manage their studies and workload so they can flourish academically.

Equitable Learning Services

RMIT offers multiple support services, including free on-campus study assistance, available to all students. Additional support is also available to ensure equal opportunities for students with a disability, long-term illness and/or mental health condition.

Language support

RMIT offers free English classes and full English courses for students wanting to improve their language skills. If your child feels they need extra help with English language or writing, we've also partnered with Studiosity to provide additional quality-assured support. Students can use the platform to chat one-on-one with subject specialists at any time, or submit their work for feedback.

RMIT Chaplaincy

RMIT's Chaplains are trained multi-faith spiritual advisers, providing support to students and staff of all faiths. RMIT's new Multifaith and Wellbeing Centre also ensures staff and students have access to a purpose-built space for worship and wellness activities.

RMIT Kirrip is designed to help your child ease into uni life, connecting new students with current students via a range of activities and events.


Clubs and societies

Is your child under 18?

If your child will be under the age of 18 when they arrive in Australia, they must have accommodation and welfare arrangements organised and approved either by the Department of Home Affairs or RMIT before they leave home. This is to ensure they have proper day-to-day support to keep them safe and well.
